

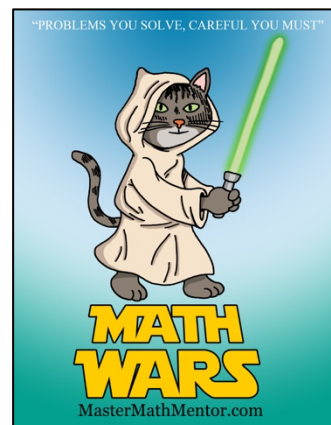
Math Wars – BC Calculus

3. (5 pts) Which of the following series converge?

I. $\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \left[\left(\frac{1}{2}\right)^n + \frac{1}{n^2} \right]$ II. $\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \left[\left(\frac{3}{2}\right)^n + \frac{1}{n^{2/3}} \right]$

- A. I only B. II only C. I and II only D. Neither

4. (7 pts) Suppose k is an integer. If $\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \left(\frac{k}{10}\right)^n$ and $\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \left(\frac{1}{n^{k^2/10}}\right)$ both converge, how many values of k are possible?

5. (9 pts) Find the sum of $\frac{4}{9} - \frac{8}{27} + \frac{16}{81} - \frac{32}{243} + \dots$
